Thank you for your letter of May 24 and the two letters of June 2, 1977.

We certainly agree with your feeling that it is ludicrous to request that PP796 be registered as a drug. Relative to this matter, I assume that Nils mentioned to you during your recent telephone conversation that Frank Kamienski and Judy McGregor were not scheduled to go to Washington to investigate the questions pertaining to the emetic petition.

Some time next week, Nils will be meeting with officials from the FDA and I heard John Braunholtz will also be present. The information you mentioned in your June 2 letter and in the telex of the same day will certainly be extremely useful. In response to your telex, I confirm sending the following reply:

"JUNE 9 OK FOR INFO TO ARRIVE. EARLY DATES IMPORTANT FOR ORTHO TO PREPARE DOCUMENTS. JNO TO GO TO WASHINGTON EARLY NEXT WEEK."

We are rather pleased to learn that the situation in Western Samoa is now also resolved. This again should have a positive impact on our discussions with EPA.
