Dear [redacted] first, let me thank each of you for agreeing to participate in the "kick off" plenary for PMAC 2018 - Plenary Session 0 - "Vision 2100: Re-imagining the End Game for the End of the Pandemic Era". Given your collective backgrounds AND personalities this session should prove to be quite an event. Our session is scheduled for Thursday, February 1, 11:00 - 12:30, following the Opening Session with Her Royal Highness. The Plenary will open with a 20 minute "scene setting" Keynote by [redacted] - who will provide an "exploration of trends and dynamics that make the 21st century" a period of extraordinary risk from zoonotic diseases and antimicrobial resistance. Following [redacted] presentation I will ask each of you to provide a crisp (up to) 5 minute statement that can be partly a reflection on the points highlighted by [redacted] and your own perspectives on the "challenges and opportunities" we face. (No power points required - but if you wish to use a slide or two let me know and we can make the necessary arrangements). Your comments should be intended to challenge the audience to think "out of the box" about the problems and the solutions - and set the stage for the rest of the conference for "innovative and creative" thinking".

A core theme across the conference is "multi-sectoralism" - how both the problems and the solutions span multiple sectors - and how we as a global community need to "break down" the silos that have isolated our human and animal health sectors, our environmental sectors etc, as well as our private and public sectors. After your opening comments I will ask several questions (ones that I will base on [redacted] presentation - so [redacted] as soon as you have a copy to share that would be great). I will discuss these question with you in advance and modify them based on your input. After, I will open it up to the audience to submit written questions which I will read.

Note, that the recipient of this years PMAC Award is "The Human Genome Project. This is an especially timely award as it highlights how the power of big data can transform medical research

and global health. It would be important and appropriate to consider how big data in other aspects of science and public health can be similarly transformative as we face the future

The session is intended to be informative but also lively, so draw on your familiarity with each other to create an intimate exchange.

For your background reading I am attaching a brief 2 page overview of the Plenary. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to get in touch

It would be good to meet prior to our session to finalize our planning. Can everyone share their planned arrival and we can then try to coordinate a meeting?
