I hope your spring is going well too, ours is off like a rocket -- I'm sure glad we're not trying to get bees out to corn fields this year. However, I suspect your summary may be timely as there's a high likelihood of bee kills occurring with planting given the early spring. I know may people had problems in 2012, the last year that we had a super-early spring here.

I've commented and used track changes in the attached document. My main concern is that the bolded recommendations do not necessarily reflect the results of CDRC research. The recommendations for beekeepers are an area where this a problem. I don't recall anyone doing research on supplemental feeding or providing water or placement of hives around a field. I realize this leaves you with no bolded recommendations for beekeepers, but generating recommendations for beekeepers really wasn't a focus of the research.

Let me look over our final report and I'll follow up in a separate e-mail if there's anything we do not want distributed.
