Hello Planning Committee members,

Thanks for a fantastic first meeting today! We really appreciate you all being able to join, and the level of enthusiasm for this project is outstanding. While FMT staff put together a more fleshed out workshop agenda with the ideas discussed today, please take a moment to follow up on a couple of things before our next meeting:

1. If you have contact information for any suggestions you may have for potential PC members and high-priority speakers, please email them to me. We expertise especially highlighted during the call was in plant health, behavioral economics, and private sector public health. I will begin reaching out to speakers next week, and we need to fill our PC roster ASAP!
2. If you have yet to submit a Bias and Conflict of Interest Form A (attached), please fill it out and return it to me at your earliest convenience (Eva, Peter, and Mark!). We will briefly discuss conflicts of interest informally in the next PC meeting.
3. As soon as you can, please fill out this [online poll](#) for your availability between **Monday, October 12 and Friday, October 23** for the next planning meeting. Remember to select your time zone and add in your name when completing the poll. After this next meeting, we will try and schedule a regular recurring call every 2-3 weeks.

Additionally, there was a discussion about divvying up workshop planning and presentations into the three categories of: surveillance, detection, and response, with cross-sectoral expertise and future action plans presented for each. This could make the planning process a bit more efficient, and might result in a clearer picture of One Health for the workshop audience. If any one of these planning subgroups particularly calls to you (or, if you object to this framework entirely!) please let Julie P and myself know.

And lastly – FMT staff are making a concerted effort, in close collaboration with our Communications Department, to reach a broader (and perhaps younger or less scientifically engaged) audience with this workshop. Trust in evidence-based scientific advice is at an all-time low, and the need for it at an all-time high. The Academies as a whole are having a bit of a reckoning with this issue right now. So, if you have any ideas on how we might take responsibility for chipping away at this growing problem with our workshop, we welcome them wholeheartedly.

The National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine work together under the congressional charter of the National Academy of Sciences to provide independent, objective analysis and advice to the nation and conduct other activities to solve complex problems and inform public policy decisions. The academies also encourage education and research, recognize outstanding contributions to knowledge, and increase public understanding in matters of science, engineering, and medicine.

In assessing potential conflicts of interest in connection with an individual's participation in decisions of the institution, particular attention will be given to the following kinds of financial interests if they are relevant to the functions to be performed: employment relationships (including private and public sector employment and self-employment); consulting relationships (including commercial and professional consulting and service arrangements, scientific and technical advisory board memberships, serving as an expert witness in litigation, and providing services in exchange for honorariums and travel expense reimbursements); stocks, bonds, and other financial instruments and investments including partnerships; real estate investments; patents, copyrights, and other intellectual property interests; commercial business ownership and investment interests; and research funding and other forms of research support.

The term "conflict of interest" applies not only to the personal interests of the individual but also to the *interests of others* with whom the individual has substantial common financial interests if these interests are relevant to the functions to be performed. Thus, in assessing an individual's potential conflicts of interest, consideration must be given not only to the interests of the individual but also to the interests of the individual's

spouse and minor children, the individual's employer, the individual's business partners, and others with whom the individual has substantial common financial interests. Consideration must also be given to the interests of those for whom one is acting in a fiduciary or similar capacity (e.g., being an officer or director of a corporation, whether profit or nonprofit, or serving as a trustee).

The conclusion that an actual or apparent conflict of interest exists is not intended to be an assessment of any individual's actual behavior or character. Rather it is a mechanism for identifying and eliminating certain potentially compromising situations from occurring, thereby protecting not only the institution but also the individual and the public interest.

The normal institutional response to a potential conflict of interest, or the direct and substantial appearance of a conflict of interest, is to remove or recuse the individual in question from particular institutional decisions to the extent necessary to eliminate the conflict. However, the institution reserves the right to take such other actions as may be necessary and appropriate in particular circumstances. Administration of this policy is the responsibility of the National Research Council Executive Office.
