Dear Dr. Suryanarayanan:

As we noted in our letter dated January 31, 2025, we are processing your request for material under the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. The Department of State ("Department") has identified an additional one responsive record subject to the FOIA. Upon review, we have determined that the one record may be released in part.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made redactions, the applicable FOIA exemption are marked on the record. Where applicable, the Department has considered the foreseeable harm standard when reviewing this record and applying FOIA exemptions. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released and is enclosed.

We will keep you informed as your case progresses. # The Freedom of Information Act (5 USC 552)

# **FOIA Exemptions**



Further study will be important to identify what role farmed wild animals may have played in introducing the virus to markets in Wuhan and beyond.

The team also visited several laboratories in Wuhan and considered the possibility that the virus entered the human population as a result of a laboratory incident.

However, I do not believe that this assessment was extensive enough. Further data and studies will be needed to reach more robust conclusions.

Although the team has concluded that a laboratory leak is the least likely hypothesis, this requires further investigation, potentially with additional missions involving specialist experts, which I am ready to deploy.

We will keep you informed as plans progress, and as always, we very much welcome your input.

We have news from Geneva that the EU indeed plans to go public with their statement Friday, but they have also agreed to coordinate with the United States and our co-signers on when that public release will be. We've proposed 3 PM EDT (8 PM CET). Right now, we are checking with partners – explaining the desire to speak with one voice with the EU, the need to post on Friday, and asking them to pave the way for signing a bit sooner than expected.
