Dear Mr. Lindzen:

This is the sixth interim response to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated May 5, 2024 that you submitted to the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) requesting records pertaining to 1) correspondence to or from three named individuals containing key terms; 2) genomic analysis authored/Performed by the named individuals; 3) a DIA-originated working paper, to include versions and corrections on or before the date of publication. The time frame requested was September 1, 2019 – January 1, 2021.

As you are aware, this case is currently the subject of litigation in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia, case number 24-cv-00982.

A search of DIA's systems of records located documents identified as responsive to the requests described above. This response addresses 14 records (42 pages). Upon review, DIA determined that some portions of 11 documents (37 pages) must be withheld in part from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA. The withheld portions are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 1, 3, and 6 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(1), (b)(3), and (b)(6). Exemption 1 applies to information properly classified under the criteria of Executive Order 13526. Exemption 3 applies to information specifically exempted by a statute establishing particular criteria for withholding. The applicable statutes are 10 U.S.C. § 424 and 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i). Statute 10 U.S.C. § 424 protects the identity of DIA employees, the organizational structure of the agency, and any function of DIA. Statute 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i) protects intelligence sources and methods. Exemption 6 applies to information which if released would constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of other individuals.

Further, DIA has determined that 2 documents (4 pages) must be withheld in full from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA. These withheld documents are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 1, 3, and 6 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(1), (b)(3), and (b)(6).

Finally, DIA has determined that the final document (1 page) is appropriate for release in full.

DIA has not withheld any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the records.

You can expect the next interim response on December 31, 2025.


