Lisa, All,

I spoke with Ian Munro about the response from the Managing Editor of Food and Chem Tox. The editor's message is that they do not want to publish this. Sue Barlo at F&CT had previously told Ian they would publish this, but the current Review Editor obviously has a much dimmer view. Even if we make an issue of this and pursue publication in F&CT, we would be getting ourselves into a long, drawn-out process at best.

Therefore, Ian recommends we withdraw the manuscript and send it to Regulatory Toxicology and Pharmacology (Academic Press, San Diego; Official Journal of the International Society of Regulatory Toxicology and Pharmacology). This would be an appropriate type of paper for this journal (this was a major issue for F&CT). The Reg. Tox. & Pharm Journal has been known to publish manuscripts like this as a stand-alone supplement. Ian believes we would be requested to make only minimal changes at worst, and that we can still get this published on schedule (1Q2000) if we act fast.

Reg. Tox. & Pharm. is a very good, peer-reviewed journal. I agree with Ian that this is the most expedient way to publish the manuscript and, therefore, support his recommendation. Please let me know by tomorrow if you disagree with this plan.
