NOT make it, I can tell you. Having said that several actions have been done and are in the works (eg creation of a scientific network in france), Regulatory approaches in Brussels, etc...but not a comprehensive strategy.

My personal view, as briefly discussed with Redacted is to have a comprehensive approach to the issue, with a multifunctional EU team. As part of the redesign, I plan to have a dedicated CA person for Roundup to coordinate and lead the EU Rup FTO Team (if agreeable to the EMEA Rup LT); I can already tell you that this person will not do all the work alone as this is not just a CA issue again. However this appointment may/will help to drive the various angles we should attack this issue.. As an example the tox issue raised in France is not related to gly AI but to the surfactants (which drove the classification of Rup as dead tree, dead fish). One (the Rup FTO team) should investigate the portfolio option to get rid of the pb and keep the business: offer gvt to withdraw these formulations and ask the gvt to make it a regulation (to have a leveled playing field) and (re)launch clean formulations (G3?). this is just the kind of ideas which need to be discussed as a team as of course these have multiple implications, while potentially changing the FTO ground for Rup in one go.

Don't want to fix the pb on email, but just give some perspective where I am. Can be assured that I will do my best to actively participate in the first Rup FTO team meeting, alongside with the newly appointed Rup FTO project lead. By the way if you have candidate names, feel free to share them with me. phc

Here's an excerpt from a recent piece of French Roundup market research. Internally on either side of the Atlantic we ask ourselves often if the FTO challenges that are being talked about mainly in France are actually impacting the business.

Since a few months, there have been negative pieces on Roundup in the French media almost on a weekly basis. The majority of growers (66%) have seen this on TV and the messages they play back in this research (slide 6) are exactly what is on these shows: 53% think Roundup is bad for the environment and 43% believe it's carcinogenic. As a reaction, 37% say they will use less Roundup in the future, that's more than half of the growers that have seen something on TV! Thank goodness only 6% think generics are better.

If nothing else, I think this highlights the need for our continued involvement in Roundup FTO in Europe and warrants some dedicated investments in France: If 37% of the growers would have used half as much Roundup in 2009, the financial impact would have been greater than \$10m GM. I'm ready to declare that we running the risk of getting financially impacted by the Roundup FTO debate in France.
